On June 18, 2006, Audi wrote motorsport history by winning the famous "24 Hours of LeMans" race with a Diesel-powered R10 race car!

The LeMans race has been held annually at the *Circuit de la Sarthe* near LeMans, France since 1923 (except for 1936 and 1940-1948).

The overall winner is the car that covers the greatest distance in 24 hours of continuous racing.

Rudolf Diesel, born in Germany in 1858, was the inventor of the Diesel engine in 1897.

An early single-cylinder prototype engine developed in 1894 ran for one minute and developed 13 horsepower.

The engine in the Audi R10 is an aluminum 90° V12 5.5 liter, bi-turbo, direct injection diesel engine with approximately 650 horsepower.
