

Germany COVID-19 Internet Stamps



Germany Covid-19 internet stamp with €1.10 stamp paying the correct rate from Germany to the USA. The handwritten letter was dated May 7, 2020 and presumably mailed shortly after, making the transatlantic journey in approximately 3 weeks (about triple the time that it normally took prior to the COVID-19 pandemic). When used, these stamps are cancelled “electronically”.

In 2020 Germany’s Deutsche Post released two designs for their Internetmarken” (internet stamps) relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, featuring:

- Heart with hugging arms and “*Vielen Dank Allen Heldinnen & Helden*” (“Many Thanks To All The Heroes”)
- House with heart and “*Wir Bleiben Zuhause*” (“We Stay at Home”)

Both internet stamp designs with a “make-up” rate of €0.05. An account & address in Germany is required to purchase these.

RIGHT →

These are MUSTER” (Specimen) test prints of the two designs. No account is required.



- German internet stamps are only valid through the end of the 3rd year after purchase.
- These stamps can be printed on plain paper, self-adhesive paper or directly on envelopes. For stamps meant to be printed on sheets of paper or label sheets, there are small “crosses” in the corners to aid in cutting the stamps from the sheets.
