

WORLD SCOUTS: JAMBOREE

JAMBOREE IS AN AMERICAN ENGLISH INVENTION FROM THE 1860'S. THE WORD'S ORIGIN ISN'T CERTAIN, ALTHOUGH EXPERTS SUSPECT A CONNECTION TO SHIVAREE, OR CHARIVARI, A FRENCH FOLK TRADITION OF GREETING A NEWLY MARRIED COUPLE BY MAKING A WHOLE LOT OF NOISE, IN A MOCK SERENADE.

THE WORLD SCOUT JAMBOREE IS A SCOUTING JAMBOREE OF THE WORLD ORGANIZATION OF THE SCOUT MOVEMENT, TYPICALLY ATTENDED BY SEVERAL TENS OF THOUSANDS OF SCOUTS FROM AROUND THE WORLD, AGED 14 TO 17.

THE FIRST WORLD SCOUT JAMBOREE WAS ORGANIZED BY THE BOY SCOUT ASSOCIATION IN LONDON. IT HAS BEEN ORGANIZED APPROXIMATELY EVERY FOUR YEARS.

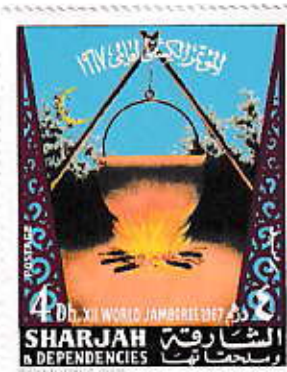
