Forwarded overseas to Godthaab, Greenland, where Professor Lloyd was acting Canadian Consul from November 1944 to October 1945 Dartmouth College added five cents foreign letter postage

Censored by New York examiner 6859, when the censors determined that the letter was not diplomatic mail despite the consulate address

Carried by ship to the Greenland - Delayed until the port became ice-free

Arrived Mar 5, 1945 per Canadian Consulate office marking

Professor Lloyd studied Inuit languages and culture while he was Canadian Consul in Greenland
