Masks are made of driftwood, animal hide, bone, pigments, feathers and walrus ivory.

Wooden mask painted black The 'Angakok' (Shaman) are the central figure in Inuit spiritualism. Shaman mediate between the world of man and the realm of spirits and the 'spirit mask' is a key part of that task.

While wearing the 'spirit mask', the local shaman performs a sacred ceremony. Beating a hide drum while chanting induces a trance-like state and allows the shaman to communicate and interact in the supernatural realm, invoking good spirits on behalf of his people.
