Ganesh Pol:
It is located at the main palace of Amber Fort. It reflects the Mughal and Rajput architecture .



Pashmina:

Chau Mask:
It is a classical Indian dance performed in the Chaitra parva and it is believed that it drives away evil forces .



Worship of Bodhi Tree:
It is a sandstone sculpture From The Sanchi Stupa at Madhya Pradesh. The tree of Enlightenment .



Sarota:
It is traditional cutter used To cut arecnut or beetle nut. Made of metal. It comes in Various shapes and forms with Intricate designs and motifs.



Peacock Gate:
It is one of the innermost Gates in Chandra Mahal in the City palace of Jaipur. It is Designed with motifs of peacock which symbolises Autumn and dedicated to Lord Vishnu.



Chaitya Hall:
It is in Karle, Maharashtra. Dating back to 1st century B C It reflects the life and work Of Buddha. Largest rock cut Chaityas in India.



Thanjavur Painting:
Panel Paintings done on wooden plank. Semi precious stones, pearls and glasswork with bright colours add beauty to these paintings.



Blue Pottery:
Traditional Craft of Jaipur. Blue glaze painting technique in Persian style with floral motives are the main features.



Glass window:
At Bagore-Ki-Haveli in Udaipur, Rajasthan. Stained glass work of 18th century.



Peitra Dura:
It is a decorative art form on Black Marble with polished precious and semi-precious stones in an inlay technique.



Zardosi Carpet:
An embroidery on carpet From Agra inlaid with gold And silver threads , studded Pearls and precious stones.
