
SOVIET SPACE NUCLEAR CRASHES

Shortly after crossing over the United States, an errant Soviet nuclear satellite crashed into Canada's Northwest Territories. The debris footprint extended to 60 miles across by 600 miles long resulting in a major biohazard recovery in the middle of winter. This cover was located in a dollar box leading this collector to locating a book telling the chilling tale of what was and what could have been. (Search: December 1977 – April 1978)

In 1996 a Soviet Mars launch attempt was said to have crashed in the Pacific, near Chile. But after a few weeks of denial, the US admitted that it erred in the site of the impact, but only after US and Chilean troops were reported to be "conducting an exercise" in the jungle, and dozens of people reported seeing falling debris. The Mars probe was nuclear powered. (11/16 - 17/1996)
