Southern Magnolia – Mississippi Statehood

Bald Cypress – Louisiana Statehood

Royal Palm – Florida Flag coil

Cabbage Palm – S. Carolina & Florida State Tree

Red Maple – NE Deciduous Forest

Live Oak with Spanish Moss – Georgia Statehood

Southern Red Cedar – Christmas Stamp

Elderberry - Haiti

Turkey Oak [r. of fox] – Longleaf Pine Forest

White Oak – US trees issue

Red Mulberry - Bermuda

Mahogany – British Honduras

Red Mangrove – USA Wildlife & Cayman Islands

Slash Pine and Saw-tooth Palmetto – Everglades N.P

Geiger Tree – Antigua & Barbuda

Lignum Vitae - Jamaica

Sea Grape – Dominica [S.S., 1/2x]
