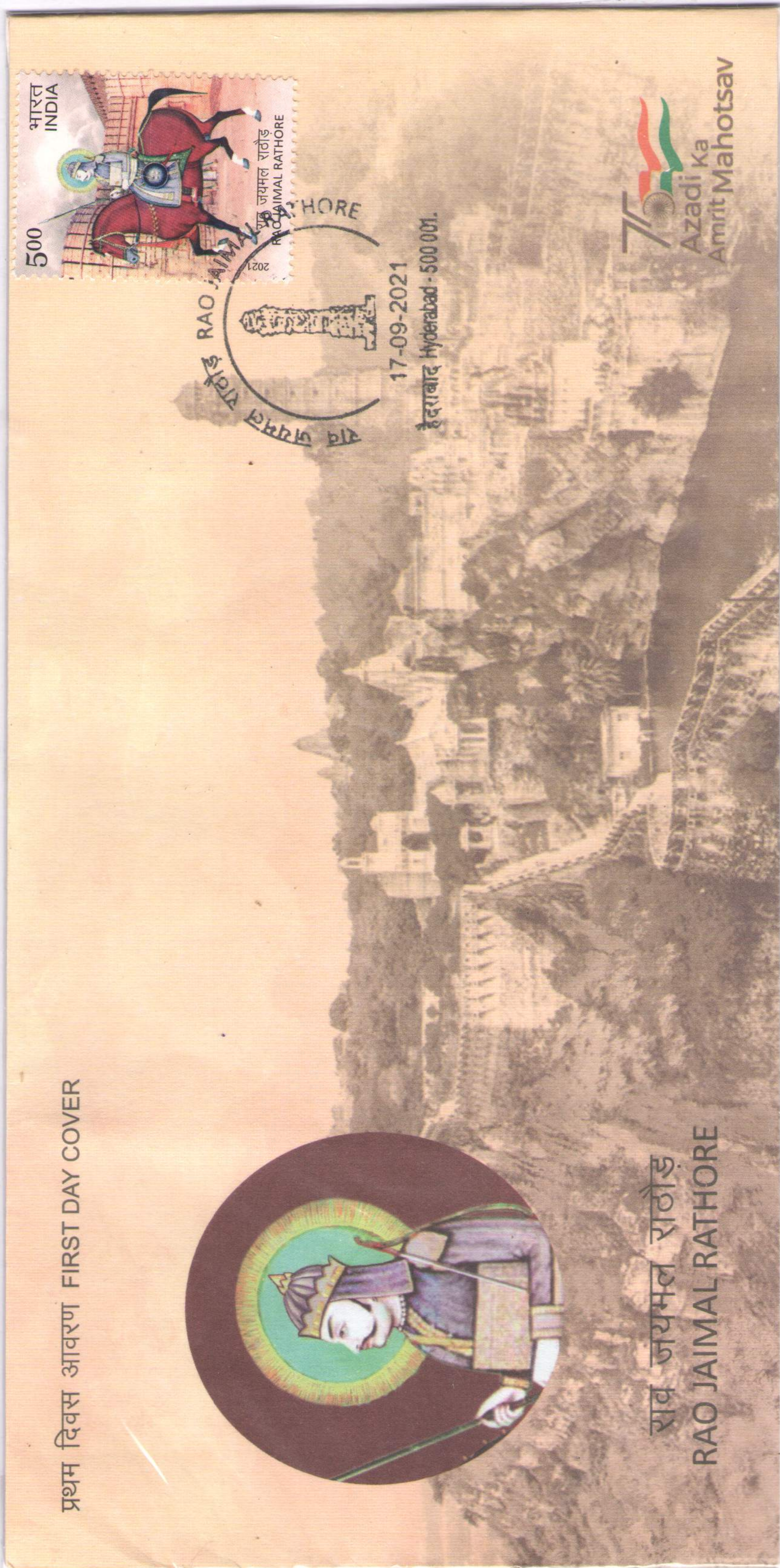


RAO JAIMAL RATHORE

Rao Jaimal was the ruler of Merta and bandore and belonged to the clan of Rathore rulers and ascended the throne after his father's death in 1544. His Fort of Chitor which was strong and protected during the Mughal invasion won him fame and glory. When Akbar launched an attack on Mewar the ruler of Mewar sought the help of Jaimal and he fought the war against the enemy for over an year and when the enemy outnumbered his men he opened the gates and was martyred at the gates of Fort Chitor by Akbar's army and till date a cenatoph celebrates his sacrifice. The stamp of value Rs5 and FDC was released by India Post to honour him during the Platinum of Indian Indpendence , Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.
