JOR BANGLA TEMPLE

Jor Bangla Temple was built in the 17th century by King Raghunath Singha Dev II. The temple resembles two or do Chala Huts put together side by side and the walls of the temples are decorated with terracotta panels describing the scenes from Ramayana and Mahabaratha. MADAN MOHAN TEMPLE

The Madan Mohan Temple was built in the 17th century by King Durjana Singh Deva in the ekaratna style. The terracotta walls describe scenes from Ramayana, Mahabaratha and the Puranas.
