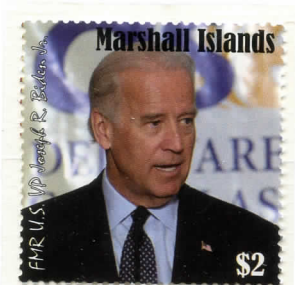
Vice President Kamala Harris, speaking in Georgia on June 11, 2022, cautioned that “over the past few years, there have been so many anti-voting laws passed that there is a danger of adjusting to these laws, as though they are normal, a danger of being complacent, complicit.”



In 1965, after years of struggle, the Voting Rights Act was passed, guaranteeing all Americans the right to vote.



In 2021, legislatures drafted more than 440 restrictive voting bills. Nineteen states passed 34 laws restricting access to voting. Over 150 restrictive bills have carried over into 2022.



President Biden, on that same day in Georgia, said “Jim Crow 2.0 is about two insidious things - voter suppression and election subversion. It’s no longer who gets to vote, it’s about making it harder to vote. It’s about who gets to count the vote and whether your vote counts at all . . . The right to vote and to have that vote counted is democracy’s threshold liberty” . . .
