walked, they did so to the tune of one of Gandhiji's favourite bhajans, "Raghupati Raghava Raja Ram", sung by the great Hindustani vocalist, Pandit Paluskar.

On April 5, Gandhiji arrived at Dandi:
 Short prayers were offered, Gandhiji addressed the crowd, and at 8:30 a.m. he picked up a small lump of natural salt.
 Gandhi had now broken the law.
