

## Letters from survivors of the Atomic bombs in 1945 WADA Susumu, Japan (bagacycymy@gmail.com)




As a person who lives in a country to have suffered the Atomic bombs and has many close relatives who survived the tragedy, I collect much stuff related to the Atomic bombs dropped on Japan.

A postal card from the atomic bombing survivor of HIROSHIMA (postmark: August 1x, 1945, Ono, Hiroshima)

Its sender wrote: ...Even now (\*11 days after the bombing), the fires continue, the number of dead is increasing daily, and the tragic sight of the injured is unbearable. ...Especially in the direction of 2nd street,

at ground zero devastated. # 23% R



A letter from the atomic bombing survivor of NAGASAKI (postmark: September 5, 1945, Nagasaki-motohakata)

Its sender wrote:...I experienced the atomic bombing at about 11 a.m. on August 9. ...The injured who fled from the town of Urakami had an unbelievable devil of a time. I cannot count

the number of people who lost their lives in the inhumane atomic bombing.

## Notes:

The Atomic bombs were dropped on Hiroshima on August 6 and Nagasaki on August 9.
