Washington House Museum 1622 Jefferson St, Two Rivers, WI 54241 June 30, 2016 Two Rivers is recognized on a Wisconsin historical marker as the birthplace of the ice cream sundae. The story goes that in 1881 a man walked into Ed Berner's soda fountain and asked for a dish of ice cream topped with chocolate sauce. The dessert caught on and Berner started selling it for a nickel, but only on Sundays.

Other cities have claimed to be the birthplace of the sundae. A good-natured rivalry was capped by the Two Rivers assertion that there is no longer any doubt: IT WAS RECOGNIZED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WHEN THE U. S. POSTAL SERVICE CHOSE TO DEDICATE THE 2016 "SODA FOUNTAIN FAVORITES" STAMPS AT THE WASHINGTON HOUSE IN TWO RIVERS, WISCONSIN.
