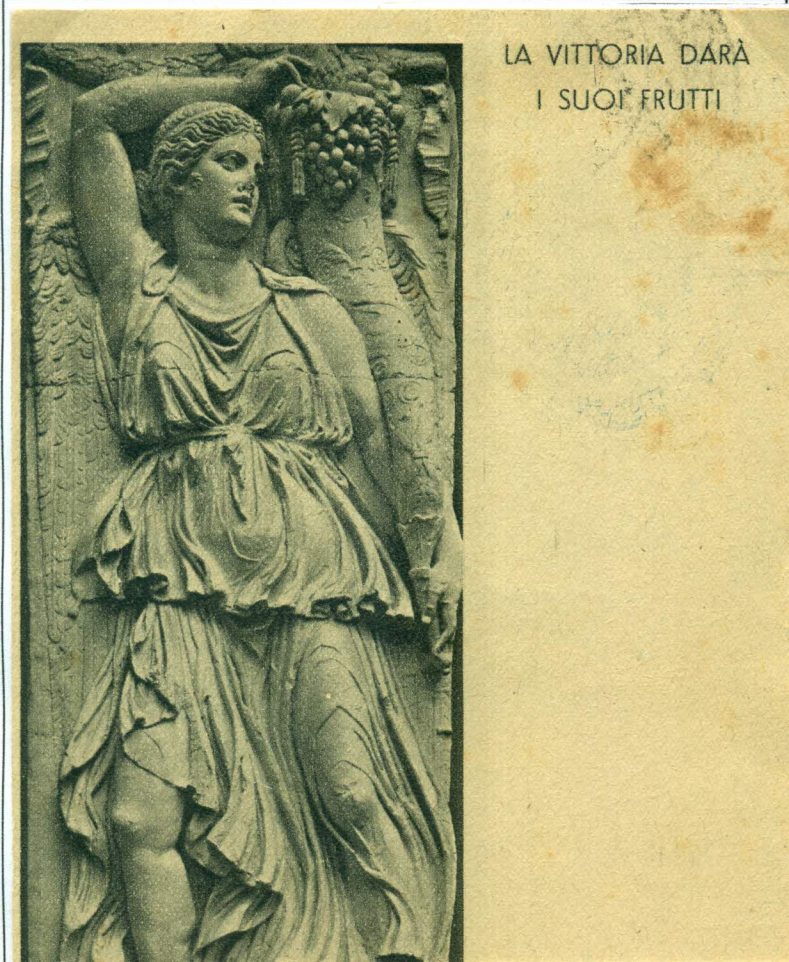


The **cornucopia**, from Latin *Cornu* (horn) and *copia* (abundance), was a symbol of abundance and nourishment. A tale in mythology involves the birth of nurturance of Zeus, hidden in a cave on the island of Crete. Baby Zeus was cared for and protected by divine attendants, including the **goat Amaltheia** = "Nourishing Goddess", who fed him with her milk by her horn. The cornucopia is shown as a large **horn-shaped container overflowing with produce and flowers** as a sign of prosperity.



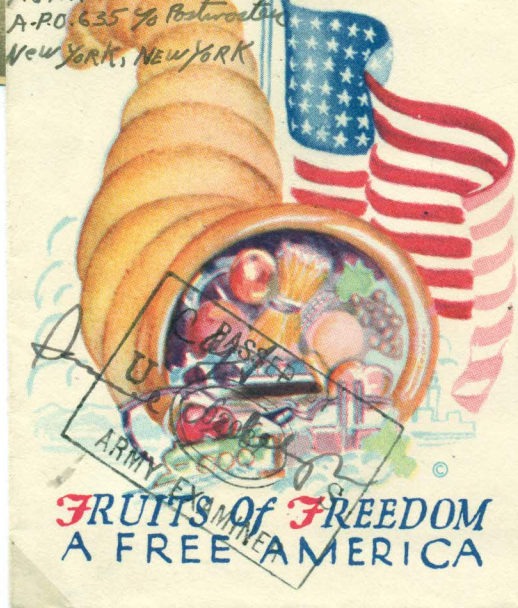
Allegory "Victory=prosperity"
