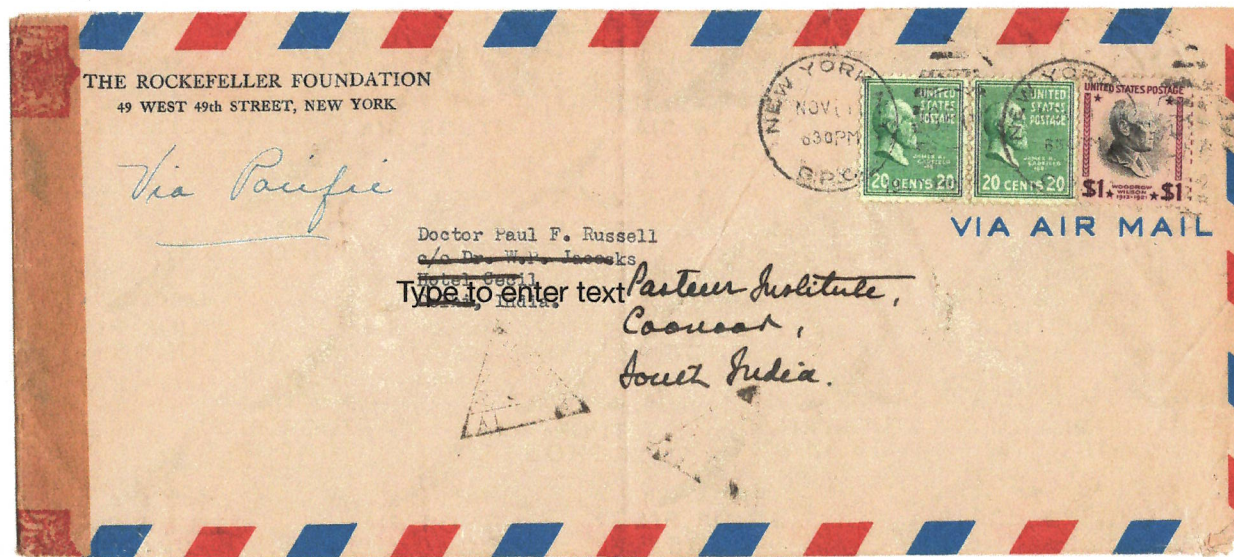


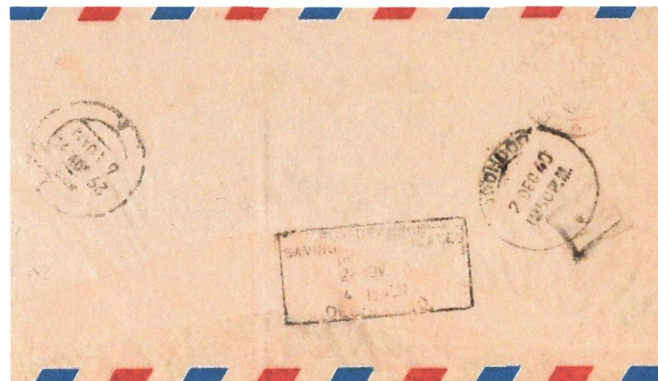
Woodrow Wilson travels the world India

From Rockefeller Foundation to Pasteur Institute India. Dr. Paul F. Russell was a research specialist and administrator for the Rockefeller Foundation for 36 years. His specialty was malaria and tropical diseases. In WW II, he was a Colonel in the Army Medical Corps assigned to Gen. MacArthur's HQ in Australia. The Pasteur Institute of India was established in 1907 in Coonoor India.



Sent 11 November 1940. Paid double 70 cent per 1/2 ounce rate to Coonoor, India (one ounce). Censored in England and India. Went through Delhi and Calcutta arriving Coonoor 2 December 1940. Back stamps and an advertisement for Defense Savings Certificates from the Delhi C.P.O.
